Forestry activities that:

(a) do not comply with local, national or international legislation, based on forest-related activities, in particular those related to the following areas:

- forestry and logging operations, including conservation of biodiversity and conversion of forests to other uses;
- management of classified areas of high environmental and cultural values;
- protected and threatened species, including CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora) requirements;
- health and labor issues of forestry workers;
- property rights, ownership and use of indigenous peoples;
- property rights, ownership and use of third parties;
- payment of taxes and fees.

(b) do not comply with the legislation of the country where a logging operation was carried out with regard to trade and customs obligations relating to the forestry sector.

(c) used genetically modified forest material.

(d) process the conversion of forests to other types of vegetation, including conversion of primary forests into forest plantations.

Note: The policy of excluding material from genetically modified forest material remains in effect until December 31, 2015.
